- Writing:
 - Research a famous person from the Caribbean and write a biography about them
 - Write a diary entry for the day that someone arrives in the UK from the Caribbean on the Windrush
 - Find out what languages are spoken in the Caribbean
 - Choose your favourite fictional book. Complete the following activities for a character in that book.
 - Find a quote in your book that typifies your character. Explain why.
 - Think of a fun name for you character. Explain why you have chosen it.
 - Find a song that reflects your character's personality.
- Oracy: Prepare a short presentation on why tourism is important to the Caribbean Islands.
- Welsh: Write a paragraph expressing your opinion on food. Use the placemat posted on See Saw to help you. Try to include positive and negative opinions e.g. mwynhau/casau and include reasons using 'achos mae'n ...'

If you need help when practising any of the following skills, please refer to units on BBC Bitesize Maths KS2 and Oak Academy Trust. Examples of questions linked to some of these skills are on the Big Maths sheets.

- Adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers
- Multiplying and Dividing whole numbers and decimals together and by 10/100.
- Area and Perimeter of compound shapes.
- Finding percentages of amounts
- Recognising equivalent fractions, decimals and percentages.
- Calculating the Mean, Mode and Median of a set of data.
- Negative numbers - ordering, adding and subtracting, differences in temperature.
- Rounding to the nearest 10,100 and decimal point.
- Positioning and ordering decimals.
- Doubling and halving whole numbers and decimals.
- Daily 10 minute session on Rockstar Maths.
