TEXTS - Teachers2Parents

You will have noticed a few changes to the texts you've received recently from the company we use called Teachers2Parents. The result has been that each message seems to come from a different mobile number & therefore the messaging / text app on your phone will probably look quite cluttered and unclear. We're really sorry about this & have discussed this with T2P. One solution you might wish to try is to receive the texts via the T2P app instead which works quite well & means that you should be able to access them via phone or wifi signal. To download the app go to your app store and search for 'Teachers2Parents'. Install, enter your phone number & then enter the verification code you'll receive and you should receive texts thereafter.

In More Depth This Month...'National Tests'

We haven't had SATs in schools in Wales for years! They were phased out for Year 2 in 2002 and for Year 6 in 2005. In 2013 The Welsh Government introduced National Tests for all pupils in Wales from Years 2-9. Initially there were two tests, one for Reading and one for Procedural Maths. In 2014 a third Maths Reasoning Test was introduced. These tests are statutory and designed to be helpful tools to support teachers and schools in assessing pupils' progress and end of Phase / Key Stage attainment. The tests do not result in a 'level', rather a standardised score. As with all standardised tests which take into account each child's age in years and months, a score of 100 would mean they were exactly at the developmental stage they should be for their age. A standardised score of 85-115 would see them in the 'expected range' while 115+ would suggest they were more able learners. Similarly a score below 85 might suggest that, when viewed alongside other professional judgements, the child might require a degree of additional support to achieve. Unfortunately if a child is unwell or absent from school for any reason, they are marked as scoring below 85 - there is no capacity for them to be marked as 'absent'. Teachers at The Dell take great care to work subtly on 'test style questions' throughout the year and to play down the formality of the tests in order to reduce anxiety and stress for the children. While we have to report the data to the Welsh Government and local authority, the results are not published. It feels very uncomfortable for teacher who create vibrant, engaging learning environments and activities to see children having to sit in rows or individually at tables, in silence, for these tests but this is the requirement. We always ask parents to support us and their children by talking carefully about these tests and not applying additional pressure.




